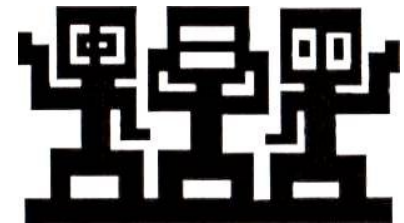
"To promote the knowledge, preservation, and continued development of African and African-American culture and art, thereby enriching the quality of life in the community and throughout the Capital Region."
